

Admission into this program is highly selective. Each year ~19-23% of applicants are offered admission. Those students who are offered admission are among the top applicants to the University of Michigan. Prospective students may apply by completing the application to the University of Michigan through the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, indicating their interest as a "preferred admit" to the Ross School of Business and completing the required essay. Students who are not selected for Preferred Admission are encouraged to apply for our BBA Program during their freshman year.

- Grades are important, as are strong quantitative skills and curriculum rigor
- Essay quality is important - succinct, well-written essays that answer the question directly are best
- Extracurricular depth is important – the Admissions Committee values quality over quantity

Only the applications of those students who are accepted into the College of Literature, Science and the Arts, the College of Engineering or the School of Music, Theatre & Dance will be reviewed by the Ross School of Business Admissions Committee.
