Mr. Porter co founded the firm and was a Partner in three EDF funds with \$120 million under management: EDF I, founded in 1987; EDF II, founded in 1995; and EDF III, founded in 1999. Mr. Porter served as interim Chief Executive Officer for two life science companies in the portfolio and founded five of the companies: Theragen, Inc., a gene therapy company, subsequently merged with GenVec, Inc. (NASDAQ: GNVC); Matrigen, Inc., a tissue engineering company, subsequently merged with Prizm Pharmaceuticals to form Selective Genetics, Inc.; Coagulation Systems, Inc., a diagnostics company; IntraLase Corp. (NASDAQ: ILSE), a developer of next-generation lasers for ophthalmic refractive surgery; and HandyLab, Inc., a developer of DNA-based point-of-care testing devices for human disease and pharmacogenomics.

Mr. Porter served as Director and Chief Executive Officer with principal responsibility for the strategic direction and performance of the company. He was recruited to ERG to formulate and implement a plan to grow a small, high technology testing business to a national company, and was subsequently promoted to Vice President, Executive Vice President, and, in 1982, to President. While Mr. Porter was at ERG, the company's business increased ten-fold to revenues of \$4.5 million, and operations expanded through five regional laboratories employing more than 100 people.

Mr. Porter's achievements during his tenure with ERG include five acquisitions to increase market penetration, expand product services, and reduce costs; obtaining financing to support company's growth; developing operating systems and procedures to achieve laboratory accreditation and certifications; and computerization of laboratory and accounting functions.

Mr. Porter was responsible for budgeted sales and profit for an outdoor power equipment manufacturer with \$25 million in revenues.
